Parish News

Spring is here! The Snowdrops and Daffodils are all showing some lovely colour and considering the adverse weather we had at the end of February, they are looking good.

Talking of adverse weather, we seem to have been reasonably lucky following Storms' Ciara and Dennis, with just a little bit of tree damage along the river, a broken gate and no flood damage in the village; that I'm aware of. If that's not the case please do get in touch because understanding of the issue will allow us to pass this information on to NYCC, so that if required we can ask for support in protecting properties.

A regular issue raised at the Parish Council is speeding in the village. This is something we take seriously and as such we have been looking into it. Those eagled eyed residents will have noticed in late November the rubber tubes on Richmond Road, Station Road and Bridge Road. These tubes measure both vehicle movements and speed. We now have the results and its pretty conclusive that the village doesn't have a speeding problem. Yes, we occasionally have a driver speedy through the village, predominantly late at night or early morning, but a typical day shows the vast majority of drivers well below the 30mph speed limit. An example was Thursday 20th Nov which had 6,389 vehicle movements along Station Road at an average speed of 22.7 mph. We will continue to monitor the situation and of course if anyone would like to become a Community Speed Watch Volunteer that would be fantastic. If you are interested please contact North Yorkshire Police at CommunitySpeedWatch@northyorkshirepnn.police.uk, who will be happy to help.

In other news we have begun discussions with Persimmon Homes regarding the adoption of land within the Gatherly Road estate. This in effect means the land then belongs to the Parish and will be maintained by us. The process is likely to take some time but initial discussions were very positive around bringing things up to a good standard before adoption takes place and the representative from Persimmon was happy to support us in making the process as smooth as possible.

As mentioned in the previous newsletter. It was brought to our attention that we need to do some maintenance work on the Cemetery, specifically to allow our contractor to keep the Cemetery safe and well maintained. We are looking at doing the work in April or May, weather and contract or availability dependant. As such again we are asking for anyone who thinks this might impact on a loved ones' grave to get in touch with us as soon as you can to give us the time to explain the work and if there will be any impact. Finally, we still have a vacancy on the council and we would very much like to hear from anyone interested in joining us. Our next meetings are 16th April and 28th May 2020 starting at 7.00pm.

Complaints have been received from residents of the community regarding dog waste. There has been an increased volume of dog waste that has been found on the common areas as well as on the private front and side lawns of residents who do not own dogs.

Whether you own a dog or not, dog poo affects everyone. It's unpleasant to see it in parks, on the pavement, and especially on your shoe! It would be fantastic to see all dog owners take responsibility by picking up after their dogs and reducing the amount of dog mess being left in public spaces. With your support,

we can help create cleaner and more enjoyable green spaces throughout the village. There are a number of designated dog poo bins throughout the village but there's no need to worry if you can't see a designated dog poo bin in sight, you can put your bag in the nearest litter bin you see.

BRIDGE ROAD CEMETERY – ESSENTIAL MAINTENANCE

It has been brought to our attention that essential maintenance work must be carried out at the Cemetery in Bridge Road, specifically to allow our contractor to keep the Cemetery safe and well maintained. In order to achieve this, we need to do some sensitive landscaping to allow access to grass cutting machinery. The aim is to reduce the impact of maintenance in terms of time and disruption in the Cemetery but more importantly ensure it is safe to do so. We understand this is a very emotional and sensitive issue for families with loved ones in the cemetery and rather than just going ahead with the work we would like to talk to each individual family, wherever possible, about the impact any work we need to undertake has on them.
